Lou Panetta enumerated the year's successes in outreach and training. We have trained over 1,100 jurors in regional and local sessions and are expecting over 700 jurors to attend our report writing workshops this fall.

We initiated a major social media campaign, primarily on Facebook, highlighting various grand jury recognition awards, report releases, training updates, and publicity from the many media sources around the state. Our social media following has increased over 25%.

EIR Awards - Best Grand Jury Report

Judi Sanderlin accepted the 2020-21 San Francisco County Grand Jury's award for **Van Ness Avenue: What Lies Beneath**. The report brought to the city's attention a hornet's nest of city government inefficiencies and millions of dollars in budget overages on the Van Ness Corridor Transit Improvement Project.

It made the front page of the local paper and received the most press ever of any report in the history of San Francisco Grand Jury.

EIR Awards - Best Media Coverage

Genoa Barrow accepted the award for her extensive, unbiased, and continuing coverage in **The Observer** of the grand jury's investigative report **Sacramento County Board of Supervisors Abandons Responsibility for COVID-19 CARES Act Spending**.

The report detailed the apparent misappropriation of \$181 million dollars and examined the questionable actions of the supervisors during the worldwide pandemic.

Grand Jury Effectiveness Workgroup



Bob Finlayson(chair), **Kati Martin** and **Jerry Lewi** described their project involving quantifying the effectiveness of grand jury reports and included a description of a visit to the state archives.

Diversity Study Workgroup

Chair, **Barbara Sommer** listed ways of increasing the appeal of grand jury service.

- Create a welcoming environment.
- Adjust Meeting times to various schedules, use Zoom.
- Time vs. productivity trade-off (1 good report better than 6 mediocre ones).
- For recruiting, in-person contact most effective.
- Contact influencers in various groups.
- Use county HR//diversity resources.
- Publicize good reports.

Each county's jury commissioner is required to maintain a database tracking gender, age range and occupation of prospective grand jurors, those selected, and carry-overs.
